



Celebrating 30 Years



On 5 November 1978 almost 2,000 runners finished the first ever Melbourne Marathon. Since then, at least 1,000 runners have completed the race every year. In it's 30th year, the Melbourne Marathon is moved its home to the MCG and this year the 75,000th finisher crossed the finish line in the history of the Melbourne Marathon.

Famous race winners include:

- Andrew Lloyd with a hat trick of victories between 1979 and 1981;
- Magnus Michelsson, with the fastest winning time by an Australian (2 hours 14 minutes in 2003) and a second win in 2004;
- Juma Ikangaa, the legendary Tanzanian runner who won the race in 1983 and 1984;
- US runner, Bill Rodgers, who recorded the fastest time ever with 2 hours 11 minutes 8 seconds in 1982;
- Sherryn Rhodes who was first woman home three times: in 1998, 2002 and 2005;
- Two-time winners, Jackie Turney (1981 and 1987) and Margaret Reddan (1984 and 1985);
- Czechoslovakia's Alena Peterkova with the race's fastest woman in 2 hours 33 minutes 2 seconds in 1992;
- Susan Hobson the fastest Australian woman in the race's history with her winning time of 2 hours 33 minutes 27 seconds in 1999; and
- Many well-credentialled wheelchair athletes such as Spartan, **lan Gainey**.

The Spartans Club

The Spartans Club was formed in 1987 to recognise those marathon runners who had completed 10 Melbourne Marathons. There are now over 1,000 runners from Australia and other countries who are members of this illustrious club. More than 100 have completed 20 marathons. In 2007, 13 Spartans, 12 men and one woman, completed their thirtieth consecutive Melbourne Marathon.




